The Power of "Rethinking" in Schools

Rethinking school amidst massive disruption means that solutions that solved old problems aren't going to address new problems. School leaders need to learn to be nimble enough to adapt midstream and emerge on the other side with the right level of self awareness and mindset in order to meet the needs of our constituents. Building on the research of top-rated Wharton professor and renowned organizational psychologist Adam Grant, come explore how we might "rethink" our assumptions and practices in the midst of significant social, ideological, technological, economic and structural disruption. As we continue to adjust to the "next normal," Rob and Garhett will facilitate a conversation around how we as school leaders can foster a sense of open curiosity and humility within our communities and our daily practices in order to create cultures of learning and exploration that embrace new ideas and perspectives to keep our schools moving forward in a sea of constant change.

The Rt. Rev. Hector Monterroso *Celebrant*



A native of Guatemala, the Rt. Rev. Hector F. Monterroso served as bishop of Costa Rica for 14 years before becoming bishop assistant in the Diocese of Texas, July 1, 2017. In addition to his experience as a missionary, and as Bishop of Costa Rica, Bishop Monterroso also served as Secretary General of Province IX (1986-2000); as editor of the Revista Anglicanos for 16 years, a magazine that served the Hispanic diaspora in the Anglican Communion; and as Secretary General of the Anglican Church of the Central Region of America. During his tenure in Costa Rica, he secured its financial stability, increased the number of clergy from seven to 29, assured that most congregations were self-sustaining, and gained governmental recognition and support for many of the Diocese's programs.

In Texas, Bishop Monterroso will continue to strengthen the growth in both Hispanic congregations as well as new missional communities and church plants. Bishop Monterroso earned an engineering degree and attended seminary at night while working for a rum company. He was ordained as a deacon in 1986, a priest in 1987 in the Diocese of Guatemala and consecrated as the Bishop of Costa Rica on June 7, 2003. He and his wife, Sandra Cardona, have two grown children: María Beatriz, a medical doctor in Costa Rica, and Héctor Ramón, a civil engineer.

The Very Rev. Ian Markham, Ph.D. Preacher



A respected authority within The Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion in systematic theology, social ethics, and religious diversity, Rev. Markham is committed to nurturing critical thinking Christian leaders, both lay and ordained, who will serve as God's witness to the world.

In 2007, Rev. Markham was appointed Dean and President of Virginia Theological Seminary. Before being called to VTS, he served as Dean and Professor of Theology and Ethics at Hartford Seminary in Connecticut and as visiting professor of globalization, ethics, and Islam at Leeds Metropolitan University in the United Kingdom. He also served on the faculty of Liverpool Hope University and the University of Exeter.

When the 1881 Chapel at VTS was lost to fire, the Dean led the capital campaign for the construction of the new Immanuel Chapel, designed by Robert A. M. Stern. During the Bicentennial Campaign, he facilitated \$40 million of campus renovation funded by a campaign that is currently at \$49 million. And as the Seminary approached its 200th anniversary, Dean Markham led the Board to create a Reparations Fund of \$1.7 million in recognition of the work of enslaved persons on the campus. Under the Dean's tenure, revised scholarship packages have led to increased enrollment, increased selectivity, and growth in the diversity of the student body.

DAVID EPSTEIN NEW YORK TIMES BEST SELLING AUTHOR

David is the author of the #1 New York Times bestseller **Range: Why Generalists Triumph in a Specialized World**, and of the bestseller *The Sports Gene*. He has master's degrees in environmental science and journalism and has worked as an investigative reporter for *ProPublica* and as a senior writer for *Sports Illustrated*. His thesis explores how students prepared to be generalists as opposed to specialists are primed to excel. His writing has been honored by an array of organizations, from the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, to the Society of Professional Journalists and the National Center on Disability and Journalism, and has been included in the Best American Science and Nature Writing anthology. David has given talks about performance science and the uses (and misuses) of data on five continents; his TED Talks have been viewed more than 10 million times.

Yvonne Adams is the Director of Equity and Inclusion at St. Stephen's Episcopal School, a 6th-12th grade boarding/ day school located in Austin, Texas, where she has worked for over 25 years. In addition to overseeing diversity and equity initiatives at St. Stephen's, Yvonne is an academic advisor, advisor of Unapologetic (Black Affinity Space), teaches health and wellness courses, leads diversity seminars and peer leadership classes for middle and upper school students, and enjoys being a house parent for upper school girls. She is an educator, school senior administrator, diversity practitioner and activist, a strong advocate for the disadvantaged and underrepresented, a presenter/facilitator at national and local conferences, community forums, and at schools across the country, and works with students, faculty, administrators, and board members to understand the institutional, cultural, and systemic processes that impact the ways in which people live and work together.
