This full-time position will teach, advise a group of 10-12 students, and participate in other responsibilities of being an independent school educator. We are looking for someone who wants to be part of a collaborative team.

Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in science, education, or a related field; master's degree preferred
- Education, training, and/or experience in student engagement and differentiation
- Successful experience teaching science to students in grades 5-8
- Ability to integrate technology to transform instruction and student learning
- Creativity, passion for the subject matter, and a positive attitude
- An appreciation for and an understanding of the social, emotional, educational, and developmental needs of learners ages 10–14
- Ability to lift over 50 lbs.
