The Middle School history curriculum focuses on the study of Western Civilization from the ancient world to 1600. The curriculum is supported by the *Great Lives* series of biographies which was written and is self-published by All Saints' Episcopal School. Seventh grade Ancient History covers basic geography in addition to the survey of the period from 10,000 B.C. to 8 A.D. which includes Mesopotamian, Egyptian, Near Eastern, Greek and Roman civilizations. The traditional chronological history is enhanced by the additional examination of the geography, literature, and art history of the areas studied.

The foundations of the class utilize the understanding of primary documents, exploring historical evidence, organize and communicate historical information, and analyze and interpret maps and visual organizers. The ideal candidate has working knowledge of authentic or skill-based assessment practices, is committed to professional development and cultural competency, and strives to make real-world connections to historical content

Responsibilities

- Plan and deliver lessons focused on Ancient history, utilizing creative and engaging teaching techniques
- Support student knowledge through a deep conceptual understanding of important historical events, inventions, and creating a connection from the past to the present
- Provide opportunities for students to demonstrate understanding through the use of project-based learning and varied assessment practices
- Assess individual student strengths, weaknesses and opportunities, address concerns as needed
