

Overview

Saint Paul's Episcopal Day School, a vibrant parish day school in historic downtown Waco, Texas, seeks its next Head of School to begin July 1, 2026. Grounded in Episcopal identity and a joyful tradition of faith and learning, Saint Paul's serves children from early childhood through sixth grade and is exploring growth.

Founded in 1956 with a vision for a school of strong Christian values and high academic standards, Saint Paul's has built a proud legacy of excellence for nearly 70 years. Located alongside the parish of Saint Paul's, Waco's oldest, continually-used church building, the School provides a rigorous, well-rounded education that develops the whole child in mind, body, and spirit. Episcopal values of inclusivity, inquiry, and character formation shape daily life, while small class sizes and dedicated faculty foster intellectual curiosity and academic achievement. Over the decades, the campus has grown to include the Carolyn Haluska Memorial Library, a computer lab, and a modernized academic building ensuring that students benefit from both tradition and innovation. Whether in chapel, classroom, or community, Saint Paul's offers a welcoming, faith-anchored environment committed to nurturing inquisitive minds, compassionate hearts, and resilient spirits in the heart of Waco.

Living in Waco, Texas

With its low-traffic volume, abundance of city parks and amenities and strong housing marketing, Waco is a great place to call home. The population in the Waco area is close to a quarter-million people and growing. The past several years have brought new shopping and restaurant options to the city and more are planned for the coming year.

The promise of new development along the river has locals excited about the city's future. With the recent additions of Baylor University's Foster Pavilion, which hosts our National Championship Men's and Women's basketball teams, Magnolia Market and the Balcones Distillery bringing national exposure to the city of Waco, city leaders and influencers are working to develop a "Riverwalk" along the Brazos that will potentially bring retail, restaurant and entertainment venues together. Major industries that have established a presence in the area include SpaceX and Amazon.

The "Brazos Commons" has received approval for millions of dollars in public support for its riverfront development project along the Brazos. Developers are slated to begin construction of the mixed-use project in the next year, which will include retail and residential space and an 11-story hotel that includes 8,000 square feet of conference space and a rooftop bar.

All this activity is creating a more inviting, competitive environment which is attracting a wider array of development, including high-end shopping and dining, the arts, entertainment, hotels, offices, residences and green spaces.







The Position

The next Head of School at Saint Paul's Episcopal School will embrace the unique strengths of the parish day school model—championing academic excellence, fostering innovative programs, nurturing a close-knit community, honoring Episcopal values, and building strong partnerships with both church and school. This is an exciting opportunity for a mission-driven, relational, and innovative leader to guide a thriving community into its next chapter, shaping academic achievement, spiritual formation, and community engagement.

The successful candidate will bring proven leadership experience in preschool, elementary, and middle school programs, with the ability to inspire and support exceptional teaching and learning. An engaging and approachable presence, paired with excellent communication skills, will be essential in building trust and collaboration among faculty, families, parish partners, and the broader community. Prior experience in an Episcopal parish day school is strongly preferred, as the next Head must fully embrace the spiritual ethos and traditions that define Saint Paul's identity.

The ideal candidate will be both visionary and grounded—capable of strategic thinking while remaining attentive to the daily rhythms of school life. Warmth, empathy, and a collaborative spirit will distinguish the next Head of School, ensuring that Saint Paul's continues to grow in both purpose and possibility while remaining a joyful, faith-anchored community dedicated to developing inquisitive minds, compassionate hearts, and resilient spirits.
