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OVERVIEW

St. Andrew's Episcopal School has been empowering Scholars, Artists, Athletes, and Servants since 1952. The school enrolls approximately 980 students in grades K-12 and spread across two campuses in Austin, Texas.

Following the recent appointment of current Lower School Head, Katy Roybal, the school is now seeking a Lower School Assistant Head to aid in the management and leadership of the division. This will be the first Assistant Head in the Lower School and will bring the leadership structure of the lower division into alignment with the structure already in place in the middle and upper divisions. The Lower School Assistant Head will join the team in July 2023.
