Athletic Director Position Statement

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OVERVIEW

St. Andrew's Episcopal School has been empowering scholars, artists, athletes, and servants since 1952. The school enrolls approximately 980 students in grades K-12 and spread across two campuses in Austin, Texas.

St. Andrew's seeks an experienced Athletic Director. The AD is an educational administrator at the school and reports directly to the Head of School. In addition to managing all 5th-8th grade and Upper School athletic teams, the AD oversees the K-12 Physical Education instruction, athletic administration, and overall fitness/training/health education at the school. The AD is responsible for integrating the school's mission into the athletic

department's goals. The AD also ensures compliance with all SPC, AIPL, and all other league rules and regulations, represents the school's athletic programs, exposes student-athletes to different opportunities, manages department finances and budgets, and assists with hiring coaches.


The next Athletic Director at St. Andrew's will have the opportunity to be a part of the development of new athletics facilities and also will have the chance to consider the opportunities that will become available to coaches and student athletes through this structural and campus shift.

THE OPPORTUNITY

Key Responsibilities for the Athletic Director

- Develop, organize, supervise, and evaluate a developmentally appropriate athletics program for the entire school, advancing the school's emphasis on positioning athletics to fulfill the mission of St. Andrew's Episcopal School.
- Cultivate in each student an understanding of and commitment to exercise and physical conditioning and health education.
- Provide leadership in defining how the new Athletics Facilities will be used (across grade levels, for faculty and staff, and for specific teams and studentathletes), develop and align

- curriculum and programming, and secure requisite human resources.
- Ensure that all coaching positions are filled with competent and properly trained coaches and that all coaches perform their duties with the highest level of professionalism.
- Collaborate with the Head of School and administrative team to recruit, evaluate, and hire athletic department faculty.
- With the Director of Human Resources, track and manage the onboarding, paperwork, and training for all coaches. Onboard and train coaches so that they are knowledgeable of St. Andrew's policies and procedures.
- Oversee and manage the coaching budget for all parttime coaches.
- Schedule regular meetings with athletic department faculty to evaluate, develop, and implement athletic instruction that reflects current pedagogy and physical fitness trends and meets optimal standards of safety.
- Report athletic achievements for circulation to the school and community at large.



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- Have the ability to develop and adhere to budgets, know inventories, and understand each team's specific financial need.
- Schedule all athletic events and coordinate the securing of game officials for all home contests.
- Oversee master athletic calendar.
- Oversee all programs' practice and game schedules.
- Champion all athletic programs by being present at athletic competitions, supporting the coaches, and promoting our teams and athletes in the community.

- Represent the school at various state, regional, and national athletic association meetings/conferences.
- Serve as an ambassador and leader among and between other schools in the SPC.
- Attend SPC (Southwest Preparatory Conference) seasonal meetings, tournaments, and other conference commitments.
- Maintain records of team and individual athletic accomplishments.
- Oversee the distribution, collection, storage, cleaning, and repair of all school athletic uniforms.
- Demonstrate a positive attitude towards students, staff and faculty.
- Have a successful history of working with young people, be fully committed to the development of a wellrounded student, and have a history of

- professional interaction patterns with colleagues and parents.
- Manage coaches as they conduct try-outs and create teams.
 Counsel as necessary.
- Be an effective communicator with all of the constituencies within the school community including alumni and parents, and especially its student-athletes and coaches.
- Be involved in the school community at large and serve as an ambassador for Highlander athletics.



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Preferred Experience of the Next Athletic Director

- Demonstrated success as an educator, coach and athletic program leader
- Ability to hire well and onboard new coaches into the culture of St. Andrew's athletics
- Able to develop a vision for a program across divisions and, preferably, multiple campuses
- Articulates a philosophy for the balance between student and athlete

 Understands how to structure a successful program for future growth
